LEGOLAND Trip

The pupils went on their End of Year trip to Legoland Windsor. This was a great day out, away from the school and time to have fun. The pupils were exceptionally well-behaved throughout the trip to Legoland and truly made the most of every moment. Their enthusiasm and curiosity shone brightly, especially during the robotics workshop, where they eagerly engaged in building and programming their creations. It was a joy to see them collaborating, problem-solving and being very creative making their own Lego ride that worked along with lights and music. Their positive attitude and respectful behaviour made the day enjoyable for everyone involved, and they represented their school with pride.





The students have developed their social, logical and strategic skills by playing board games. They like playing maths and logic based games like Prime Climb and Qwirkle, social games like Hedbanz, and the time-honoured classic: chess.



In English this term, KS3 have done some fantastic learning about the Shakespeare story of Macbeth. We watched a short animated series of the play and became familiar with the characters and key themes. In Maths, we have been learning about statistics and different graphs and charts, while in Science, the focus has been on forces. In Geography, pupils worked on a research project about Volcanoes and Earthquakes and in Computing, the topic has been about an online coding programme called Scratch.



AQA Awards

This term, pupils have been working hard towards their AQA certificates and everyone is extremely proud of their efforts and achievements. Combined we have had over 200 certificates for the Pupils. have gained awards for learning in subjects like Maths, English and Art, but we have also been focussing on specific topics that pupils are interested in, as AQA has so many different awards to choose from! It has been wonderful to see such a variety of learning taking place, from the moon to Vikings and video games!



KS4 Subject/topics

In key stage 4 English we have been analysing and writing debates by spotting and using different rhetorical devices. Some engaging topics have been “Should zoos be banned?” and “Is gaming a waste of time?”; which have sparked a lot of well-articulated discussions.

In maths we have learnt about probability and taking averages; and also representing and understanding data via tally charts, bar charts, pie charts and scatter graphs.

In ICT we have been coding our own multiplication quizzes in Scratch; implementing different pictures, sounds and effects to produce a fun and entertaining challenge.

Allotment

With the lovely weather this term, we have been able to visit our new allotment twice a week and pupils have really enjoyed spending time outside there. Pupils have worked hard to prepare our plot, tidying up and weeding and have begun to paint the raised beds. Adrian has chopped back some of the overhanging bushes and we have hung up bunting which the pupils designed. Back at school, pupils have been looking after plants they chose to buy from the allotment and these are growing very quickly- we already have three tomatoes! Pupils have also made their own plant pot out of clay and have planted some seeds which will start to grow over the summer holidays.
